

ShotSpotter® and Oakland Public Safety

ShotSpotter is an acoustic gunshot detection system that uses an arrayed network of sensors to "listen" for loud, impulsive sounds pops, booms, and bangs—that may be gunfire, and then pinpoints the point of origination of the sound via triangulation. That sound is then filtered through computers to dismiss noises that are clearly not attributable to gunfire. The remaining sounds are then reviewed by highly trained acoustic reviewers in our Incident Review Centers.

Through precision knowledge of gunfire, patrols do not spend time canvassing a large area securing a scene and looking for evidence. In a world of short-staffed departments, ShotSpotter enables smarter and more productive deployment of resources.
